St. Stephen's WELCA projects include serving bereavement meals for families of church members, delivering flowers to shut-ins, serving debt retirement meals, supporting ELCA missions in Tanzania and the Lutheran Disaster Relief Fund, providing support to local women and children's shelters, and providing meals to USC students.

A major emphasis of our circles is learning through devotions, and Bible studies. Some circles choose to select a book for circle members to read and discuss at monthly meetings; other circles prefer to have members lead them in a short devotion.

Promoting fellowship among our members and the community is a priority. We sponsor a Mother-Daughter-Friend Luncheon for all women of the church and their guests, a fund raiser each year to finance our events and projects and all circles meet together annually for fellowship and study, and to coordinate our projects.

## WELCA COMMITTEE GUIDELINES

### WELCA COMMITTEE GUIDELINES

The work of St. Stephen's WELCA is based on three missions : **Action, Community, and Growth**. An Executive Committee, comprised of representatives from each circle, coordinates the church and community wide activities related to the focus of these missions. Each circle has the responsibility for planning and organizing specific activities related to these missions each year. The circles coordinate the activities on a rotating basis. The circle responsible for the key projects of the mission establishes the preliminary plans and members of all circles participate in the activity to ensure the project is successful .

Key circle wide activities that are essential to actualizing the following missions:

#### **MISSION: ACTION Purpose:**

This mission deals with how we respond to God's love. It seeks to establish women to act upon their faith as disciples in all areas of life.

We demonstrate this by serving bereavement meals; supporting projects addressing world-wide hunger relief and domestic disaster relief, donating layettes, health kits, and school supplies; providing for the needs of community homes for women, children, and veterans; and serving meals for students at USC.

#### **MISSION: COMMUNITY Purpose:**

This mission addresses how we as women are to relate to each other. It seeks to enable each woman to value herself and others, and to build up and celebrate relationships that are global, diverse, and interdependent.

Examples of activities related to the community mission are: planning and sponsoring the annual Mother-Daughter-Friend Event, preparing debt retirement meals, conducting fund raisers to finance events and projects, working with other groups in the church in coordinating church receptions, covered-dish meals, and church-wide social events

#### **MISSION: GROWTH Purpose:**

Growth reflects our relationship with God. This mission seeks to provide a variety of learning experiences that strengthen each woman as a whole person, develop her potential, and equip her for ministry.

Some examples of how we embody growth include providing educational programs; promoting publications of WELCA, informing members of retreats; supporting conference meetings and conventions; and overseeing the annual WELCA Sunday worship service,

## EXPLANATION OF OFFERINGS

### Regular Offerings

St. Stephen's WELCA contributes \$250 quarterly to the statewide organization to be used for general operating expenses on the state and national level. This offering is collected monthly at circle meetings and turned in to the church office or given to the treasurer. It is then sent four times a year to the state treasurer.

### Circle Offerings

Most circles have a "Sunshine Fund" which is usually kept in the circle. This fund is often used to purchase food to be prepared for bereavement meals, to send cards to members who are ill and/or shut-ins, to send greetings to "special friends," or used in any manner decided by the membership.

### JOY Offerings

These gifts are given in thanks for the many blessings we receive and used to support designated ministries of the SC WELCA organization including justice and advocacy work administration of grants and scholarship programs and printed and online resources. Members drop a coin in a box at any time they experience a feeling of joy and thanksgiving as a means of showing gratitude to God for our many blessings." These offerings are collected twice a year (May and November) within the circle and sent by the treasurer to the state organization.

## BEREAVEMENT MEAL PROCEDURES

The pastors will confirm with the family if they would like a family meal, light dessert refreshments/reception or no meal. If they want a meal, the pastor will notify the Bereavement Meal Coordinator of the type of meal, time, location and expected number.

The Bereavement Coordinator will contact Circle Bereavement Coordinators on a rotating basis with information on the type of meal to be provided and the time and number of people expected. For larger gatherings more than one circle may be asked to serve.

The pastors or church administrator will contact the property manager and indicate the number of tables to be set up for meals served in the Social Hall.

### Information for Circle Bereavement Coordinators

- A meal should include a meat or main dish, 2 or 3 vegetables, a starch (i.e. macaroni & cheese or potato salad), salad (i.e. green, fruit or congealed), bread, and dessert.
- Refreshments for a reception should include finger sandwiches, cookies, brownies or other bar type cookies, fruit, cheese straws or nuts.
- Light dessert refreshments should include cookies or cake/pie.
- If items are left in the kitchen or refrigerator before the meal, they should be well labeled.
- For meals and refreshments that are served at the church, follow the directions on the coffee maker to make tea and coffee. Make sure coffee creamers and sugars are available.
- Provide pitchers of water as well as sweet and unsweet tea. Lemonade may be provided for reception or dessert meal.
- Table clothes are in the office. Ask someone to bring flowers and/or greenery from their yard to decorate the buffet table and the round tables if possible. Vases can be found in the closet next to the parlor in the Social Hall.
- Assign at least 2 to 3 people to set up and serve the meal depending on the size of the group.
- Assign at least 2 to 3 people to clean up after the meal. Place dishes in the dishwasher and put them away after it is run or hand wash dishes and put away. Wash pots and pans and return them to their proper places. Leave the kitchen clean and tidy.
- Circle members should take the tablecloths and dish cloths home and launder and return.
- If a circle needs help purchasing items such as the meat or main course, there are some available funds. Please contact the Bereavement Meal coordinator.

## ALTAR FLOWER PROCEDURES

The Women of the ELCA and the Worship and Music Committee have established a joint project known as the Altar Flower Program, beginning at St. Stephen's in 1997. An explanation of how this program works is as follows:

At least a week in advance, the Parish Administrator will contact the person who has agreed to provide flowers for the worship service. She will also contact the circle representative for that month to remind her to check the chart for deliveries to be made.

The flowers are available immediately after the Wednesday noon worship service. The flowers should be delivered as soon as possible to members who are hospitalized or shut-ins. If one or more members are currently hospitalized, it is usually recommended that they receive one of the vases. If there are no hospitalized members, names of shut-ins will be provided.
