

The nativity scene located in the narthex in front of the statue of St. Stephen has been given to St. Stephen's Lutheran Church by Craig Wheatley in memory of Thelma Meetze Derrick. Andrea Morris, Art teacher at White Knoll High School created the details on the nativity figures to make them reflect the authentic look of how the characters would have looked at that time of the birth of Christ during the transition of BC to AD. The backdrop was cut out by Palmer Wheatley, and painted by Mrs. Morris. Mrs. Morris painted an interpretation of the midnight sky of Bethlehem. The blues and purple shades include all of the traditional colors associated with advent and the coming of the newborn savior. During the season of advent, the nativity table is covered with a blue tablecloth and for the twelve days of Christmas a gold tablecloth will replace the blue tablecloth with hay and additional river rocks being added to the scene. It is the hope that this nativity will enhance our worship and tell the story of Christ's birth at St. Stephen's for years and generations to come.


We will continue offering families the opportunity to gather in the Social Hall (each family at a different table) where we will have time for

Some reminders as we increase our worship opportunities:

- In-person worship services will continue to be conducted in the Sanctuary and the Gym.
- Worship services will be held in the gym on Sundays at 9:45 AM (no singing), in the Sanctuary at 8:30 and 11 AM (singing) and on Wednesdays (no singing) at 12:30 PM.
- Virtual worship options will continue for those that do not feel safe or cannot attend in-person services.
- Please keep yourselves socially distanced at all times while on campus, especially as you proceed to and from worship.
- Hugging, handshaking, and any other physical contact are strongly discouraged.
- It is <u>highly recommended</u> that each worshipper wear a mask and keep it on for the duration of their time on campus. Masks are <u>required</u> for services with singing.
- If you are able, please park in the big parking lot adjacent to the cemetery.
- Handicapped parking and a drop-off for those with limited mobility will be offered in the small parking lot and circle drive, respectively.
- We ask that no one park in the circle around the fountain so that it may be used for dropping off those that have limited mobility.
- Offering plates will be located by the doors. You can give your offering as you enter or exit. We will not pass offering plates during the service. You can still give on our Givelify app and on-line at www.sslc.org.
- Family units will get their communion elements (individually packaged wafer and wine) as they are seated.
- A nursery is offered during all Sunday Worship Services and during Sunday School.
