


#### Ready for a road trip?


## **Notes from Aloft**

Greetings! I'm writing this the morning after the Hymn Sing. What a wonderful evening filled with some very tasty chili and lots of good fellowship. The highlight of the evening was singing such wonderful hymns, led by Dr. Justin Addington. Thank you to those who came. We look forward to having another hymn sing later this spring.

One thing I was reminded of as we sang was how the hymns shape our Christian journey. No matter what stage of life we are in, music plays a part. Composer Olivier Messiaen said "The joy of music is that it can go beyond mere words – which are too precise. Music can express what there is in the soul."

The singing of hymns inspires and uplifts our worship. Singing together is a corporate action. We are called to make a joyful noise. Our voices offer praise and adoration to our God.

Perhaps this thought is best conveyed in the hymn text for ELW #851 "When in Our Music God is Glorified". No better hymn has been written about the reasons for the use of music in worship. The last verse gives us the charge – "Let every instrument be tuned for praise; let all rejoice who have a voice to raise; and may God give us faith to sing always: Alleluia!"
